# GME Updates

## New Common Program Requirements – Safety and QI

- Programs must provide formal educational activities that promote patient safety-related goals, tools, and techniques.
- Residents must participate as team members in real and/or simulated interprofessional clinical site-sponsored patient safety activities.
- Residents and faculty members must receive training and experience in QI processes, including an understanding of health care disparities
- Residents must have the *opportunity* to participate in interprofessional quality improvement activities, including activities aimed at reducing health care disparities

# GME Updates

## New Common Program Requirements – Wellness

- Residents must be given the opportunity to attend medical, mental health, and dental care appointments, including those scheduled during their working hours
- The program must educate faculty members and residents in identification of the symptoms of burnout, depression, and substance abuse, including means to assist those who experience these conditions.
- Residents and faculty members must also be educated to recognize those symptoms in themselves and how to seek appropriate care.

# GME Updates

## New Common Program Requirements – Learning and Working Environment (DUTY HOURS)

- Residents must have at least 14 hours free after 24 hours of in-house duty call. (all residents, removed limits on PGY1s)
- Time spent in the hospital or at home performing clinical responsibilities by residents on at-home call must count toward the 80-hour maximum weekly hour limit.
- The frequency of at-home call is not subject to the every-third-night limitation, but must satisfy the requirement for one day in seven free of duty clinical work and education, when averaged over four weeks

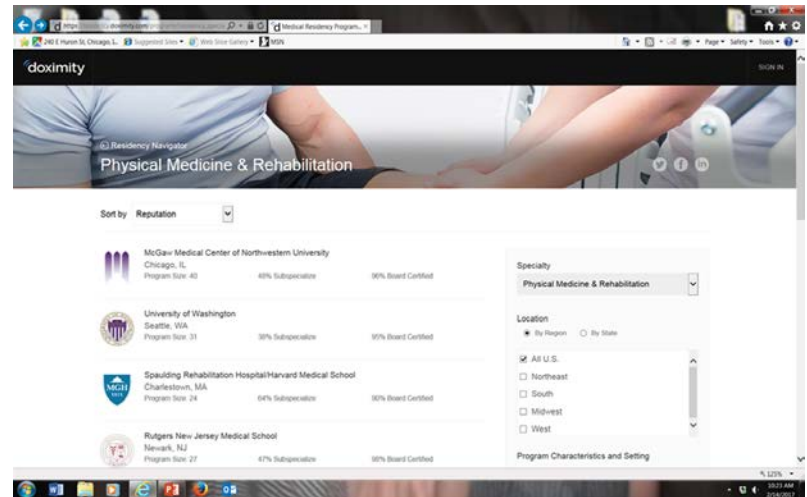
